### **Multi-axis Turning with Mark Sfirri**

What a great demonstration! Last month, Mark showed us how he turns one of his iconic figures. He was able to take a process that at first blush is mind-boggling and made it look rather simple. By using 6 different axes and beads and coves, he created a sculpture that looks carved, not turned.

Mark also talked about his commissioned sculpture, *Building Blocks*, that can be seen in the Bucks county Community College Linksz Pavilion. Selected from dozens of submissions from across the country, Mark's sculpture reflects the building blocks of knowledge acquired at Bucks and throughout life. 
